Expressions of interest are invited from part time or full time staff members of Justice Health and Forensic Mental Health Network (or from NSW Health Local Health Districts if working directly with Forensic Patients in a medium or low secure mental health units) who wish to undertake a two year part-time Masters degree in Forensic Mental Health. The scholarship, funded by Justice Health and Forensic Mental Health Network, will reimburse students for a maximum of 50% of the program fees incurred after awarding of the scholarship (up to a maximum of 50% of the program total cost if each course in the program were to be completed successfully on a first attempt).

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Applicants must:

1. Hold part-time or full-time employment with Justice Health and Forensic Mental Health Network (or with NSW Health Local Health Districts if working directly with Forensic Patients in a medium or low secure mental health units). Those with a job offer with the Network or relevant LHD will also be considered (but the scholarship will be confirmed only if the job in question is subsequently commenced by the applicant within the first term of enrollment in the program)
2. Be a permanent resident or Australian citizen
3. Provide a letter of intent (maximum one page) outlining reasons for application (i.e. how enrolling in the Masters of Forensic Mental Health degree will enhance your professional development, make a contribution to your employer and the broader public health system).
 - Note, for psychiatry registrar applicants those that have completed all or majority of the RANZCP administered assessments will be prioritised.
4. Provide a supporting letter/email from your present direct line manager
5. Enclose a brief (2 page max) Curriculum Vitae documenting training, experience and specific skills relevant to the application (focused on eligibility for enrollment in the degree – i.e. having completed a relevant undergraduate degree and having either a further relevant academic qualification or 2 years of relevant professional experience).
6. Enclose copies of relevant professional qualifications.

FEES

Successful applicants will present their UNSW invoices to the School of Psychiatry for reimbursement.

Continuation of the Scholarship is conditional upon successful completion of all coursework requirements each term (i.e. reimbursement for the costs of an enrolled course will be dependent on having passed all previous courses).

Fees will not be reimbursed for courses not successfully completed (even if fees have been paid by the student).

Fee reimbursement will not be made for courses completed prior to the scholarship being awarded (although current MFMH students can apply and will be eligible to seek reimbursement for up to 50% of the cost of any course completed following scholarship awarding)
